## How to mark your ballot(s):

**Right:**

- Use a #2 pencil when marking your ballot.
- Complete the arrow(s) ← ■ pointing to your choice(s) with a single bold line, like this ← ■.
- When voting for candidate(s): Complete the arrow(s) pointing to the candidate(s) for whom you wish to vote.
- When voting for question(s)/proposition(s): Complete the arrow pointing to the answer which you desire to give.
- When voting for a write-in candidate (when allowed by law): Write the person's name on the blank line provided and complete the arrow pointing to the person's name. Do not write-in a person's name if the person is already listed as a candidate for that race.

## How to mail your ballot(s):

1. After marking your ballot(s), **ENCLOSE** and **SEAL** ballot(s) in the small envelope.
2. Fill in the information on the small envelope as required.
3. Sign the small envelope.
4. Your signature on the small envelope **MUST** either be witnessed by 2 individuals who must affix their address or a notary. **Note:** If there is no place on the small envelope for the 2 individuals to witness or a notary your signature does not need to be witnessed or notarized.
5. Place the small sealed envelope containing your voted ballot(s) in the large envelope addressed to the Board of Elections.
6. If the large envelope addressed to the Board of Elections calls for postage to be affixed you must affix the correct amount of postage for the envelope to be delivered to the Board of Elections.

7. Your ballot(s) must be received by the Board of Elections by 8 p.m. on Election Day in order for your ballot(s) to be counted.

### Need assistance?

If you need assistance in the casting of your vote, contact your local board of canvassers.

### Made a mistake on your ballot?

If you make a mistake when marking your ballot, DO NOT erase or cross out on the ballot. Instead, immediately contact the Office of the Secretary of State's Elections Division at 401-222-2340 or TDD 711 to make arrangements to receive a replacement ballot.

### Attention:

Per Board of Elections Rules & Regulations any person who has applied for a mail ballot and presents themselves at the polls to vote on Election Day shall be required to cast a provisional ballot.

If anyone attempts to intimidate or unduly influence you or interfere with your right to vote, contact your local board of canvassers.
