














FORT BARTON WOODS TRAIL GUIDE

CAUTION: Trails in Fort Barton Woods are challenging in places because of uneven terrain and slopes that require physical stamina and sure footing.

Visitor Etiquette and Regulations

This area is maintained for the quiet enjoyment of the public and is to be used in a way that protects its natural and cultural environment. Town Ordinance Sec. 54 establishes regulations for public use, as summarized here:

- Visiting is allowed between sunrise and sunset.
- Visitors must stay on marked trails.
- Dogs must be leashed or under positive control, and kept on marked trails.

Take only pictures.Leave only footprints.



- NO possession or consumption of alcohol.
- DO NOT leave trails or use unmarked trails.
- DO NOT remove or disturb vegetation, structures or any object intrinsic to the site, (e.g. stones, artifacts)
- NO littering, camping, smoking, hunting, trapping, paintballing, campfires.
- NO bicycle riding or horseback riding.
- . NO motorized vehicles.
- NO metal detectors.

Directions

Highland Road, Tiverton:

Some areas are private property.

Visitors must stay on marked trails.

From Route 24 in Tiverton, take Route 77 (Main Road) south toward Little Compton. At the Old Stone Bridge, take a left onto Lawton Avenue. Fort Barton is at the top of the hill at the intersection of Lawton Avenue and Highland Road.
